# PRESIDENTS REPORT LEE VIRGIN

Apologies to all but I'd like to put my own perspective on the last 12 months or so even though the CEO covers a fair bit of this in his report.

As the final paragraph of my report last year said – "I hope you come along for the ride"!

Well look what happened, North Adelaide won it's first premiership for 27 years, a timeframe none of us want ever to see again. We can put our success down to a whole range of things including the Football Review and the subsequent decisions made by the Football Dept, the Coaching group and the Board but in my opinion, the group that took control of all that was the playing group and for those people who were able to attend the 2017 Barrie Robran Club Champion night, they heard every player who won an award categorically state that the bond between them all was inspiring them to do everything they could to achieve the success we all desperately wanted.

It goes without saying that senior Coach Josh Carr was finally able to get a much more consistent response from the playing group, they were a lot fitter after another solid pre-season and our recruits fitted in beautifully and added much needed depth, coupled up with the further development of the younger brigade as well as more and more experience in the senior players.

Put that all together and led by inspirational captain Max Thring, Vice-Captain Alex Spina and the notable on-field leadership of some of those more experienced, it was no surprise to many of us that we had the makings of a very good, tight knit group. It should also be noted that for the 2nd time in 3 years, we also won the Reserves Grand Final and congratulations go to Coach Jacob Surjan and his coaching group and the players for having a great year also.

The Reserves only used 41 players for 2018 and because there weren't too many injuries, they were able to maintain a reasonably consistent side and keep the pressure on the senior list, something that has not been able to happen for some time.

Under 18's Coach Craig Brooks and "Surj" communicate constantly to make sure any potential player gets the opportunity to play at a higher level and ensure they become accustomed to the playing style of the Senior Coach as soon as practical.

A big thank you goes to "Surj" and Craig for their tireless efforts in developing and nurturing our future stars.

Having said all of that and the fact that we have all revelled & enjoyed such a wonderful finals series and ultimate Premiership glory, the Club and the coaching group in particular, face some significant challenges in 2019 not the least of which is the 2 game penalty imposed upon us after the Preliminary Final.

We also start the season without 5 of our premiership players – Connor Rozee, Boyd Woodcock, Callum Wilkie, Jordon Sweet and Robbie Young. As you would expect, we are immensely proud of each and everyone of them and wish them all the best as they go into the AFL system. Like we have done in the past with our previous draftees, we will watch them with great interest and encouragement, hoping they do themselves and their families proud as well as the North Adelaide Football Club.

As a footnote to my last comments, one of the Football Review recommendations was to increase our local and zone talent wherever possible and I'm pleased to say that of the players who took to the field in the GF, 57% was "local" and that doesn't include the very unlucky Alex Spina. As members, you can be proud of this as there is nothing more exciting than seeing our younger guys come through the grades and develop into the players of the club's future.

In relation to SANFL, as always there are a number of very significant matters that they have had to continually deal with this year as well as other things that emerge which have or will have a big impact on all the SANFL clubs.

Heading that list is the financial position of the SANFL, without that being in a healthy state, the very underlying fabric to support the clubs would not exist and some of the other clubs would surely not exist in their current form.

Hence at the time of writing, SANFL have announced a plan to develop a Hotel at the Adelaide Oval which hopefully will give them the opportunity to generate significant extra income away from existing traditional sources, but also an asset to solidify the balance sheet once AAMI stadium has been written off.

The SANFL this year will record a budget surplus of \$100k which is well below previous years as they continue to pay the clubs according to the AAMI land divestment programme and retire debt. Each club received a further \$275,000 in October taking total payments to \$775,000 so far of the expected \$2million over the life of the stadium sell down.

The SANFL was able to reduce its debt substantially from \$14.5million down to \$7.3 million this year.

Club Equalisation funding continues for the time being and a CPI increase of \$13,900 for 6 clubs will be provided and another 2 clubs will receive an equalisation payment based on a review of those club's financial circumstances.

On a more positive note, the SANFL have a new major sponsor in Statewide Super and Channel 7 have agreed to continue their sponsorship agreement for another 3 years.

The Grand Final attendance of 40,355 was the highest since 1998 resulting in a \$70k "better than budgeted for" bonanza for the SANFL – no doubt because we had so many supporters come along to cheer our boys on!

To finish off the SANFL component, 2018 season was the highest scoring and lowest stoppage state league competition – further proof that we are indeed the best brand of football at the local levels.

In relation to our own financial results, as has been mentioned over the last 18 months or so, the Northern Tavern has struggled due to the change of ownership of the complex and the subsequent redevelopment after the major tenants departed.

We will report a loss of \$80,754 compared to a profit last year of \$122,453. Pat Hodby will elaborate in more detail at the AGM but "one off" expenses including, the solar panels, picket fence, the new audio system and signage at the Oval had an enormous impact on the results this year.

Financial results such as these are disappointing and while we are still able to continue with our debt reduction programme according to plan, the Board is very much aware of the need to diversify our own sources of income and investment so that we too can be protected against the risks of what has become traditional income. Despite our efforts to date, nothing that we have considered so far was of sufficient quality to progress further with. You can be assured that this matter is constantly being discussed and looked at.

The Football Review, which we owe a great deal to and which gave us some real clarity around areas it thought we could improve on was such a big task to absorb, let alone put into practice, yet you all embraced it because we knew this could only benefit the football club and if we stuck to the plan and recommendations, then this should put us in good stead to achieve success not just in the short term, but also ensure we had the right structures in place to continue successfully for many years to come. As I said at the Football Forum previously, the Board was unanimous in its support of the Review, contrary to what some people out there may have thought otherwise.

I have been asked by a number of members what some of the Board members do throughout the year and I suppose it is timely to mention perhaps the 2 Board members up for re-election just so that you have a bit more of an idea of what goes on away from the football scene for those two in particular.

Wayne Jeffries, apart from being Club Chairman, is our long standing Zone Director and clocks up his usual 10,000 to 15,000kms visiting our vast country zones representing the Football Club either during the week or weekends at various functions, formal gatherings and Northern Area meetings and carnivals, using his vast knowledge and long standing relationships to keep the NAFC brand well and truly in those areas.

Andrew Souter, as mentioned previously, over the last 2 years used his commercial and leasing skills to the utmost in securing a new leasing arrangement for one of our venues and at the same time brought on board a fantastic new sponsor for 5 years, which was worth a considerable amount to the club. As we all know, sponsors are extremely hard to find these days, so to broker that particular sponsorship for the NAFC was a fantastic effort.

As a group, we have achieved so much yet, we know there is much more to be done to ensure the Club survives the considerable challenges ahead. We are a tremendously diverse Board, each bringing something different to the table and I'm sure we are the envy of many other clubs who are in the unfortunate position of having to rely on so few to do so much.

So to Wayne Jeffries, Malcolm Ellis, Pat Hodby, Andrew Souter, Simon Trenorden, Chris McSporran, Susan Girke and Conny Wilson – a very big "Thank You" indeed.

It has been an absolute privilege to be yours and the North Adelaide Football Club's President for the last 12 months and let's continue to work together in 2019 – Football Dept, Coaching Group, Administration, Players, Support Staff, our magnificent volunteers, the History Committee and last but certainly not least the wonderful Presidents Group who raise so much money for the benefit solely of the players and coaching panel.

If we all adopt the "Club First" mentality, then collectively as a football club, we surely cannot be any stronger and more committed to a common cause.

Let this be the beginning of another great era of the North Adelaide Football Club and go you Roosters!

# **CEO'S REPORT**GREG FOWARDS



### SEASON 2018 - PREMIERSHIP YEAR!

I remember writing to our Members at this time last year and stating that there was a lot to like about season 2017, not the wins and loss ratio, but rather the emergence of several young players and a game style that was built on pressure, competitiveness and ball movement. This was taken into the pre-season and further refined to the point where it was obvious the players were completely vested in the vision laid out by their coach, and the positive results which would come if they persisted and committed unconditionally.

As we now know, the result of all the hard work and belief is the 2018 League Premiership Cup!

Our first in 27 years, a long wait for so many Rooster supporters who have stayed with us and each year prayed for this to come along. What a fantastic result for the Club! The look on those faces on Grand Final night was priceless, the joy and elation of success was celebrated for many days and weeks and in some areas, continues today!

In addition, for our Reserves team to achieve Premiership success was testament to the pressure that was building within the selection process each week, all players pushing hard for a spot, keeping the boys in the League side on edge each week. That's what brings success, relentless selection pressure demands high performance.

The young talent on display was a talking point around the finals series, the excitement of watching Connor Rozee stamp himself as one of the top elite 18 year old's in the country and seeing Boyd Woodcock accept the challenge of League football, and make a name for himself as a high pressure, very smart footballer who took on each challenge the coach threw at him. Then we saw Mackenzie Slee up against and beating some of the best small forwards going around, whilst Jordon Sweet made sure we had a big aggressive presence around the stoppages, protecting his teammates and using his great athleticism to our advantage.

Our new faces like Jarred Allmond, Aidan Tropiano, Robbie Young and Brock Castree all played their roles to perfection and gave the team that bit of extra polish, skill and speed that was targeted in the off season. And who can forget the wonderful seasons of Tom Schwarz, Mitch Clisby, Lewis Hender and of course, our 2018 Best and Fairest winner, Callum Wilkie.

For me, the most notable effort came from our senior coach Josh Carr. He has always stayed very strong and focused, especially when under close scrutiny, however his ability, persistence and belief in the vision and values communicated to the players throughout the past 3 years has been outstanding. When we struggled to find form in the latter part of the season, when everyone thought we had seen our best and expectations had dropped, Josh's ability to manage that situation and continue to be relentless in his preparation to win finals, was a credit to him as a coach and manager of his team. Very ably supported by Jacob Surjan and Trent Mills, two outstanding coaches in their own right, he put our Club back to where it needs to be.

Now we move forward into 2019 as the reigning Premier and face the challenges that will confront us from round one. The competition will gain strength and we need to as well!

In addition to our 2018 success, we had our second season of the SANFL Women's League, after playing in the inaugural Grand Final in our first season. Our second season had many challenges, two new clubs (South and Sturt), so boundary and zone changes impacted to a degree on all the inaugural teams. However, our team was outstanding and had chances to again play off in the Grand Final, ultimately losing the Preliminary. Big thanks to our coaching group, Matt Slade, Yves Sibenaler and Nathan Steinberner, as well as our wonderful support team, especially Kevin Bateman, Ashlee Lines and our Football Manager, Darryl Wintle.

### CORPORATE PARTNERSHIPS

Growing corporate support for the Club is one of the biggest challenges each year. Over recent years we have been able to grow against the trend, this growth built on great sponsorship packages, relationships and connection. Whilst these philosophies have continued under the eye of our new Sponsorship and Functions Manager Meneka Mendis who replaced Jessamy Lutt at the end of 2017 when Jessamy commenced her maternity leave, it is growing more difficult in the current economic climate we operate in.

In such an exciting year on field, we fell slightly short of our target in this area, mainly due to a few circumstances out of our control. In saying that, we still increased our sponsorship revenue by nearly \$20,000 over 2017, a great result for Meneka in her first year with us. We plan to hit the corporate market a bit harder as we get the wheels in motion for 2019, and with the Premiership under our belt, we hope to add a few new faces and businesses to those loyal committed partners who have stayed by our side through thick and thin.

Remember the most important thing in maintaining the corporate support we have comes down to the support they receive from our members, so I ask you all to consider that upon making your purchases and choices.

A special thank you again goes out to our Presidents Group Committee for their continued commitment and support for our Corporate Partnerships, often connecting and involving our Partners in their fundraising programs, whether it be the TTG Golf Day, Home Match luncheons, Gala Luncheon or any other function or event. Once again, we have the best Major Partner in the SANFL with Copyworld Toshiba and once again, the support of David Morris and his team has been vital in our ability to fund critical areas in our operations such as junior development, country zone academies and the female football programs.

# MEMBERSHIP AND WEBSITE

An SANFL executive once said to me that the Roosters have the biggest supporter base in the SANFL, they just don't attend matches and aren't all members. You only had to be at Adelaide Oval on Sunday 23 September to witness the masses of red and white around the 40,000 spectators....perhaps he is right!

Club Membership levels have remained stable at around 2,000 in 2018 which is a good result following some lean years on field. However, we really need this to grow in 2019 to 2,300 - 2,400 and following the success in 2018, we hope our big supporter base will get on board and get our membership up to where it should be for a Premiership Club.

We always are indebted to our wonderfully loyal supporters who continue to outnumber our opposition supporters at Prospect each home match. Our Marketing Manager Allira Ryan with assistance from our admin assistants Ashlee Lines and Olivia Smith, has again been committed and dedicated in her communications, website management and membership.

Following our Grand Final win, the work done behind the scenes from the final siren of the game through to the next 2 - 3 weeks was amazing. Special thanks to Ashlee Lines who manned the office on her own amid celebrations and ensured the premiership apparel, DVD's and other items were ready to be ordered and produced for our supporters. It was truly an unbelievable time!

The NAFC website remains one of the busiest websites in the SANFL, but we will again look at upgrading it for 2019 to meet the changing needs of our customers. It is always an evolving project and we intend to stay ahead of the SANFL in terms of visits and content.

### NORTHERN TAVERN AND GRAND NORTH

Whilst 2017 was a very difficult year for our venues in terms of revenue generation, 2018 was even harder. The Northern Tavern has been under development (the Regency Plaza Development) which has impacted on our business there enormously in 2018. At times, the car parks were basically closed, general access was very restricted and foot traffic through that corner was non-existent. In line with this, our gaming, bar and bottleshop revenues decreased significantly and if it wasn't for the outstanding efforts from our Manager Kate Cotter, it could have been much worse.

The good news is that the development works should be complete in the first quarter of 2019, allowing us to resume normal trading and promotional activities.

Grand North has been negatively impacted by the emergence of the surrounding competing venues, all of which have had significant upgrades and refurbishments. Whilst our dining business has remained strong, our gaming (10%) and bar (5%) revenues have reduced.

We have some plans in place to re-energize the venue for 2019, but we don't underestimate the challenges ahead. In a difficult environment our Grand North Venue Manager Tania Hubbard and Head Chef David Wilcox have both done marvelous jobs in maintaining superb customer service standards, delivering high quality food and continuing to build on the well-recognized reputation we have for great service, great food and great atmosphere.





### LOOKING AHEAD

Finally, in line with the above, our consolidated financial performance in 2018 has been well below budget for the reasons provided above. In saying that, whilst the venues have struggled, we are proud of the financial results delivered by the NAFC operations, finishing ahead of budget by in excess of \$200,000. This was of course assisted by a wonderful thing called The Premiership!

Key projects for 2019 include the finalisation of lease negotiations at Grand North, the continuing Prospect Oval Development project (and sourcing the funds to commence), the completion of the Regency Plaza developments and of course, the pursuit of another Premiership. Thank you to everyone; it has certainly been a year to remember for all of us!

Look forward to an exciting 2019 as we again head TRUENORTH!

### HISTORY COMMITTEE

The year started with one of the Club's most important events – induction of four new members to our Hall of Fame at a function held on 11th November 2017. While most of the preparatory work was completed in the previous football year, there is always a lot to do in the last couple of weeks. In particular, the establishment of the new display cabinet with 3-D images of each Hall of Fame member set into crystal blocks was finished just in time for the function.

The Committee had been working for several years to identify as many players as possible who have represented the Club at League level. This had been completed back to 1910 by the end of 2017 but the picket project required us to identify as many players as possible who debuted between 1897 and 1909. In the end we were able to identify 109 of these players in time for the pickets to be produced - the remaining 12 have only surnames on the pickets. Record keeping and available sources in that era set us quite a time-consuming challenge! In May, as part of History Month, the Committee again ran bus tours which highlighted our Club's origins. The tours took participants to several key landmarks in Adelaide which have great relevance to our early history. Nick Haines again orchestrated and conducted the tours which were thoroughly enjoyed by all participants. Other highlights of the year included:

- Organising three functions during the 2018 season for past players and officials of the Club. These were very well attended, with the second one attracting a record number of past players.
- Establishing a new display in the main display case, featuring the various guernsey designs that we have worn through our history.
- Continuing cataloguing items of memorabilia received from various sources and an audit of all memorabilia in our archives undertaken by Julie Vranek and Colin Richardson.
- Addition of photos of players to the Games and Players
  Database. This has been completed for most players but there are
  many for whom we have no photo and we are seeking help to locate
  something suitable.
- Designing a new display for Adelaide Oval which should be in place shortly.
- Assisting with arrangements to celebrate the 50th Anniversary of the writing of our Club song by Johnny Mac. Although the work was undertaken by the State Library, we were delighted that the task of digitising the contents of the fabulous Farmer scrapbooks was completed this year as part of an agreement struck in 2005 when the material was deposited in the Library on indefinite loan. This will ensure that this important part of our history is preserved.

I would like to record my gratitude to the members of the History Committee for their continued hard work and dedication. The list of Committee members is provided under "Office Bearers". Barry Dolman

The now-customary Good Friday clash with Central District brought nothing good to the North Adelaide camp as they were completely dictated in all departments from the opening bounce that brought immediate concerns about the new season's aspirations. Without the choice of our first two ruck options due to injury and suspension North were out-played in the midfield and were led to the ball in all areas of the ground. Early poor goalkicking by the Bulldogs remained the only reason North held some hope at the main break. New captain Max Thring (24 disposals) battled manfully but had limited support although Brock Castree (22 possessions), in his first game for North, showed promise rebounding regularly and cleanly from half-back and Tom Schwarz added midfield support. Mitch Harvey was the lone figure up forward and kicked three goals from limited opportunities. Aidan Tropiano played his first game while Jarred Allmond and Robbie Young played their first games for North. Alex Barns played his 50th SANFL game.

Commentator Anthony Hudson's memorable quote "I see it, but I don't believe it" was a catchphrase to the North faithful when the home side put on a clinical performance not witnessed by their fans for years. Kicking with the wind in the first term North hit their straps immediately with captain Thring kicking the first goal and setting the high standard. An eight-goal to nil first term set the match up built around aggression, team ethic and run, run, run. By the time West kicked their first goal in time on of the second term North had already notched up 12 themselves and held an imposing lead. The procession continued in the second half as North remained relentless in their play with players constantly willing to receive a handball and forwards presenting incessantly that included goals scored within seconds of the ball being bounced in the centre. Thring again led by example hassling the opposition when not in possession and presenting opportunities when he had the ball and his final stats of 16 kicks, 12 handballs and two goals were testimony of his second and third efforts. Despite his size he not only collected 12 marks but one was a spinning grab between two bigger West opponents. Tropiano (24 touches) supported his captain while up forward Keenan Ramsey was brilliant with strong leads, accurate kicking and sharp snapshots to finish with 17 kicks, nine marks and a career-best 6.1. Young Mark Quinn, returning to the league side, had a day-out with 10 marks, 14 kicks and a five-goal delivery. The defence were miserly and worked in tangent to clear from defence with clean movement and run. Callum Wilkie (22 kicks, 10 marks), Allmond (20 kicks, 10 marks) and Tanner Smith (14 kicks, 10 marks) led the defence wonderfully. Mackenzie Slee, on debut, also enjoyed a solid first game and vice-captain Alex Spina's celebrated his 50th club game. The 138-point margin was the biggest in North-West history, and the 164 points scored by North their 3rd highest ever against West.

In a pulsating final quarter when no goals were kicked North held its nerve and showed a new and determined side in its performance when it defeated the reigning-premiers Sturt at Unley Oval – our first win on their home soil since 2012. The victory was vastly different to the previous week's performance when they fought back after looking down during the third term but showed a spirited fightback to take the two points.



The victory was led by a tough midfield and a dominating backline. Tropiano continued to justify coach Carr's eagerness to have him at the Roosters collecting 23 disposals and a goal but also pulverizing the opposition relentlessly with 13 tackles. In defence the tall timbers in Cameron Craig (20 touches, nine marks) and Smith (16 touches, 10 marks) stood large on the wet and windy day. Ramsey remained a strong forward option and with Harvey led well and kicked straight – important in such a low-scoring game kicking two goals and at the same time reaching 50th goal milestones: Harvey (for North) and Ramsey (total). A. Barns, against a taller and bigger ruckman, was again brilliant in his 50th game for the club collecting 16 possessions around the ground, grabbing seven marks and clocking up 23 hit-outs. Young, while quiet for parts of the game, scored the goal of the day with a brilliant individual run from wing to goal 40 metres out on the run. The final siren brought thunderous cheers to the North faithful and with good reason – it was North's first consecutive win since the last two matches in 2014 and the first game in 2015!

North Adelaide continued their impressive early season form with a third successive victory that entwined glitz and glamour with belief, aggression, committed defence and a team ethic that was obvious for all to witness. Many goals were kicked with dazzling snaps or precision long-distance shots but all were underlined due to pressure up-field, strong tackling, quick rebounds and a willingness to do the one-percenters to support each other. After kicking the first goal of the game within 15 seconds of the match by nippy forward Young North pinched an early break when they kicked the last three goals of the first term. Evidence of North's aptitude and commitment was Schwarz's brilliant tackle on Norwood's giant ruckman resulting in a free kick and the quick movement by the North brigade resulted in a goal. It was also the nine-goal third quarter that was awesome in every facet of the Roosters game plan. The goals were kicked in all fashion with Young snagging three and Allmond, after a 15-possession first term, kicking a goal from 60m out that continued over the fence. However it was North's clean ball skills, pressure on the opposition and hard running that resulted in many of these scoring opportunities, and perfectly displayed by the "team" goal of the day when Mitch Clisby kicked long from a kick-out where Lewis Hender took a "screamer" in the middle of the ground and, before landing, shot a handball to A. Barns who was running past. His kick found Leigh Ryswyk loose at half forward flank whose 40m precision kick allowed the gut-running Young not to break stride as he ran into an open goal. It was one for the ages! In was an "all-played well" performance however Young's effort symbolised the team as his six goals (including a successive goal of the week contender during the final term) was balanced with his willingness to work defensively (including six tackles) that showed his all-round performance. Allmond was sensational with his long and accurate rebounding to finish with 35 disposals, 10 marks and two sensational goals. Midfielders Schwarz (29 disposals, 10 tackles), Tropiano (21 disposals, 2 goals) and Thring (25 disposals, 7 I50s) dominated stoppages and were relentless in their pressure acts. Tall defenders Wilkie (26 disposals, 10 marks, 6 D50s) and C. Craig (22 disposals, 8 marks, 5 D50s) continued their great form constantly intercepting marking and confident rebound.

# FUN FACT JUMPERS 1 TO 10 ALL IN A ROW

In Round 2 against West Adelaide we saw North jumper numbers 1 to 10 running onto the ground. If you would think this was a common occurance you are wrong. The last time a North league side had all 1-10 jumpers represented in the same game was in Round 12, 1970 – nearly 48 years ago. In that match North defeated West Torrens by 57 points at Thebarton Oval. Many reasons can explain this strange stat including injuries, players playing reserves and in some cases the number put in cotton wool for a season or two (ie No. 10). This year only 5 of the "Top 10" jumper numbers played every game this season with Mark Quinn (No. 6) only playing five games. Some of the players representing North that day in 1970 are champions of North's yesteryear including Don Lindner (No. 1), Terry von Bertouch (2), Neil Sachse (3), Geoff Paull (6), John Phillips (8) and of course Barrie Robran (10).

The Rooster juggernaut season of 2018 continued and took its second major scalp on the opposition's home turf when North Adelaide held out against the Eagles in a fantastic display of football by both sides. Matt McDonough set the wheels in motion with two long-distance goals in the first term before debutant Connor Rozee calmly kicked his first goal in league football. Scores remained close through majority of the game with each side sharing the lead in a topsy-turvy encounter. The Eagles goaled early in the last term to take the lead but North's new-resolve and never-say-die attitude responded with five of the next six goals in an 11-minute burst that sealed the match and North finally enjoyed success at Woodville Oval – only their 6th in 29 encounters! Leading from the front was the irresistible captain whose statistics of 23 kicks, 9 marks, 11 handballs, 11 I50s and three goals speak volumes of his run and domination but his ability to draw teammates into the game and lead by kicking three crucial yet wonderfully crafted goals confirmed this surely as his best individual performance. With over 400 disposals in the match North dominated possession with Allmond and Castree (both superb in repelling across half-back) notching 31 and 30 disposals respectively as seven others collected 20 or more touches. A. Barns, whilst beaten in ruck by a more prominent opposition ruckman, certainly held his own around the ground with 23 touches, 11 marks, two goals and 17 hit-outs. Matt Appleton (22 disposals, 4 tackles) showed what can produce, Schwarz (27 touches, 8 tackles) continued his no-nonsense consistent performances and Wilkie (19 disposals, 11 marks, 1 goal) remains unquestioningly reliable. It was in 2007 when North last won four successive wins while young 18 y.o. Rozee's debut also created a new record that makes many us feel that little bit older – he is the first North Adelaide league representative to be born in the 2000's!

North maintained top place on the premiership table with a gritty, dour, blue-collar victory over a determined Adelaide. Getting to a game-high 31 points during the second term North looked cleaner, quicker and its ball movement more organised before Adelaide battled gamely to fight their way back into the contest. Twice during the third term scores were locked away before a late goal to Hender gave the home side a slight lead into the last break. North's defence stood even grander in the final term allowing just one behind to be scored while North's wayward 2.5 was enough to give them their first win against Adelaide since 2015. North's victory was completed without captain M. Thring who left the field in the first quarter due to injury and Castree who spent a lot of time on the sidelines. Wilkie continued his stellar season regularly intercepting entries into our defence and then delivering precision passing to teammates. He knocked up 28 touches, 11 marks and six R50s. His sidekick in Allmond was again at his brilliant rebounding best with 24 touches, 3 R50s and 4 I50s. North were soundly beaten in the ruck yet A. Barns (19 touches) and Harvey (three goals including his 100th SANFL goal) made amends around the ground. An aspect the Roosters certainly took from the game is that they can now match any opposition tactics thrown at them with their usually fast-tempo, high-disposal movement balanced by a more cautious, and analytical ball movement to cut through the opposition flood tactics. Debutant Chris Barns was written into the "first kick, first goal" history books – just like his brother did against the same club four years earlier!

The bye (due to the State match) seemed to effect North's attitude and intensity as they could not match South Adelaide's chip and run ball movement, tall timber and harder running. North had the first break in the scores with two late goals in the first term however an accurate South opened their lead in a dominant second term. The second half was frustrating for the red-and-whites as they could never seem to obtain control of the match yet midway through the third term were still only one goal behind. A poor and inaccurate last term summed the match up when their 0.4 to South's accurate 5.0 indicated the difference in efficiency for both teams. North's inability to win centre clearances despite winning their share of hit-outs was a clear concern as well as South's ease of clearing their D50. An indication of where the majority of the game was played is shown that two of the top three possession-winners (Smith – 25, C. Craig – 23) are tall defenders. Their performances were gallant despite the constant barrage they received. Schwarz and M. Thring (especially early including goaling from one of North's best plays of the day) battled tirelessly but could not hit the high standards they have placed on themselves as Allmond (in his 150th SANFL game) continued to thwart opposition attacks. On the back of a fully-committed, determined mindset, resilient defence, crisp ball movement and an undisciplined opposition North wiped their surprising poor performance the previous week to produce quality football to completely dissemble an 18 AFL-listed Magpie contingent with a first-half that was simply sweet football to witness. The traditional Queen's Holiday Monday bout between North and Glenelg continued in a gritty contest with the Roosters holding off the Tigers for a 10-point victory. With a difficult breeze playing on the players the game remained tight with neither team able to string any continuity. After a tight first half North broke the game open when they kicked the first three goals of the third term to stretch to a 20-point margin. From then to the end of the game it was an arm wrestle as it appeared as one team kicked it was replied by the other immediately. A brilliant four-goal second quarter by powerful forward Harvey was the catapult for North's stunning victory over the more fancied South Adelaide in the Roosters first final since the 2013 Grand Final. The red-and-white finals tsunami gained colossal momentum after the Roosters smashed the reigning premiers Sturt by a whopping 58 points to move into the Preliminary Final. From the first bounce North Adelaide were brilliant: ruthless, committed, passionate, skilful and full of run, run, run – this was North Adelaide playing their best football for years. With the dynamic Hender causing mayhem in attack, Clisby the 'cool as a cucumber' defender controlling the backline and the uncompromising, tough Tropiano dominating the clearances North were in control of every section of the ground. A five-goal first term set the tone before a second half domination saw North kick 8.8 to 2.0 in a barnstorming victory. Hender kicked five goals (three in the final term) within his 25 disposals, Clisby gathered 24 possession and 10 marks in the back 50M and Tropiano collected 15 kicks and 19 handballs around the packs. Smith, Woodcock and Allmond were also main contributors. Young AFL Draft prospect Rozee did his AFL aspirations no harm with a stunning 24 disposals and 10 marks.

A Preliminary Final that will be placed in the record books and remain etched in SANFL folklore for so many reasons saw the mighty Roosters came from the depths of a huge deficit to produce and incredible, stirring second-half performance and run out winners by less than a goal. A great crowd witnessed a match of two halves with the much-fancied Eagles dominating the first half - and early in the third term - before North began the almighty comeback. After the Eagles kicked the first three goals of the third quarter North were 47-points in arrears (the scores 17 points to 64) and looked down and out with the Grand Final seemingly a game too far. However the Roosters, riding on the back of the inspired "never-say-never" Young, started to gain some ascendancy to kick some goals in succession and finally built momentum of their own. By the time the siren ended the quarter North had kicked the last five goals to leave them behind by a margin of 20 points - still outsiders for victory but a margin to evoke some belief. And belief was what North had as they continued into the final quarter with a barrage of goals - including a passage of seven goals in a brilliant 12-minute burst that contained an incredible snap by Woodcock over his shoulder - that not only thrusted them into the lead but to a 22-point lead. Late goals to the Eagles put the margin back to less than a goal before the final siren brought euphoric scenes to the Roosters faithful. Throughout the miracle comeback the Roosters suffered the loss of vice-captain Spina (broken collarbone) and captain Thring (leg) but were superbly led by Wilkie (30 possessions, 12 marks) relentless in defence, the tireless tackle-machine Tropiano (20 disposals and a staggering 15 strong tackles) a workhorse in the trenches, and Ramsey, Woodcock and Young constant annoyances for the Eagles defence with three goals each. North Adelaide are PREMIERS for 2018 after a high-scoring, high-skilled and highly entertaining encounter in front of a record 40,355. North were clearly the underdogs with Norwood in a perfect position as North dealt with the controversy following the preliminary final and having lost their VC Spina to injury and their passionate captain Thring under an injury cloud throughout the week In an absorbing battle where the lead ebbed and flowed throughout the match North's start could not have been better with Harvey goaling in the first minute of the match. Accuracy was important and it kept the Roosters in the game when Norwood had periods of controlling the match. With nothing in the game at the final break North Adelaide's fitness, passion, skill under pressure and the simple belief and confidence in each other proved to be the nucleus to run away in the final quarter when the red-and-whites kicked 5.3 to 3.1 to win by an 19 points. North were simply a champion team with everyone playing their role when required perfectly. Tom Schwarz was tough, relentless and consistent he collected 26 possessions and seven tackles to be a thorn for Norwood. His seasonal partner in crime in the packs, Tropiano, could not have produced a better debut season and his brilliant finals series concluded with a typical Tropiano match: 19 contested disposals and another 10 strong tackles. The unheralded Castree, the less highlighted recruit, was superb running out of defence with defiance and confidence picking up 25 disposals along the way. In attack North were jam-packed full of scoring potential and all the main stars: Barns (four goals), Harvey (three), Woodcock (three) and Hender (two) were ruthless in their potency on the scoreboard but their defensive mindset was also evident. Youngster Jordon Sweet held his own in ruck against a more experienced and bigger foe. The victory was even more historic having been the first from the Elimination Final to win since 1984, and the first since 1964 to come from bottom the previous year to premiers (North won as many finals games as they won for the whole 2017 season). Add the icing was North's youth with Wohling (4th match), Sweet (8th) and Woodcock (9th) now premiership players. The victory followed the North Adelaide Reserves team who won their Grand Final as well against Norwood earlier in the day and a fitting farewell for veteran Leigh Ryswyk who could not get up from injury for the league but was able to play in this match.

Firstly, I want to sincerely thank the loyal Roosters members and supporters for carrying us through a great finals campaign, it was a time I will never forget I remember writing last year how we fell short in several matches in 2017 with narrow losses from late in the match, and a key for our preparation for 2018 was to be able to maintain the pressure and intensity for the whole match, ensuring we were always a chance. It was certainly one of the many focusses for 2018 that we feel was critical in our Premiership success. The other areas were the continued development of our young players, the improvement of our senior players and the role our new recruits would play.

The season started as we had planned and hoped, apart from round one of course! That game proved to be exactly what we needed in hindsight, it made us understand that good trial form along with a solid pre-season campaign is of no benefit unless you



bring attitude, pressure and intensity. The following week against West Adelaide we delivered it all and set ourselves back in the right direction as we prepared for the top teams the following few weeks. To get to the mid-season milestone on top of the ladder was great, but it didn't guarantee the good form would continue in the face of a few key injuries and some poor weather. We soon found ourselves struggling to cope with the oppositions pressure resulting in a loss of confidence and a few question marks around some players who had previously been very good. Whilst we suffered 4 losses over the last 6 rounds, we did gather some momentum along the way which would prove important. I felt our season turned once we knew we would play finals footy, and we would be playing South Adelaide in the Elimination Final. I can now admit that our preparation for the last 2 rounds against Norwood and Port Adelaide were really all about playing South Adelaide in the first final, hence I why brought in some young boys into those matches and moved a few roles around. We had seen South play a couple of times through the year, and we all know what our form had been like against them over the past 4 or 5 years, so we needed to be fully prepared for them. In the back of our minds, we also knew that if we could get past South, we were a chance. When looking back, the decisions to bring in Boyd Woodcock, Connor Rozee and Jordon Sweet were more than satisfying and gave us some real energy when we most needed it. Those 3 players were crucial in the way we lined up through the finals with Connor going back, Jordon working aggressively in ruck allowing Alex Barns to play forward, and Boyd playing the small defensive forward role.

In a Premiership year, you expect that the AFL Clubs would have more chance to look over your players and the likelihood of extra interest surfaces, and I am proud that we could produce 5 premiership team players who can now begin their journey at AFL level. They all have their own story, and we can now take a special interest in their progress and challenges, and be there for them if they need us.

Special thanks to our Head of Development Jacob Surjan who came in and gave the group real enthusiasm and energy right from the start. His work with our Reserves Premiership team all season was fantastic, and the development of our defensive game at League level was a vital ingredient to the ultimate success achieved. Also thanks to Trent Mills our Midfield Coach for bringing real experience and professionalism to the group. Trent is a winner, he sets high standards and expectations of his players and they follow him. Thanks again to Craig Brooks for his work with the Under 18 programs and the junior development squad support he gave, and also for assisting us on match day in the box. Darryl Wintle has worked hard all year to ensure we are fully prepared off field regards our playing list requirements, support staff and our medical and training staff, and thanks to our CEO Greg Edwards and our Board for all their support and understanding of our needs. Of course, a big thanks to all of our support staff, we have the best in the business!

We now face the big challenge of 2019, the competition is getting harder and as the reigning premier, we will be hunted more than ever. Rest assured, we are hungry and remain the hunter! See you in 2019!

# CENTURY WIN

North Adelaide's 138-point victory against West Adelaide was certainly one to saviour for the Rooster faithful. It was North's first win over 100 points since 2013 when we defeated South Adelaide by 105 points – 26.11 to 8.14. We then have to travel back to Round 22, 2007 for the next most recent 100-point win. In that game North defeated West Adelaide 22.15 to 6.7 to win by 104 points. Out of the 24 occassions North had a triple-digit win the Round 2 138 points is the 4th highest – still 40 point behinds North's 178-point annihilation against South Adelaide in 1972 (34.22 to 6.12).

# **GOALS GALORE**

The Round 16 scoring shootout against Adelaide resulted in both North Adelaide (141 points) and Adelaide (121) both registering over 100-point for the match. This is the 226th time in North's 2343 games that this has taken place with the previous occurrence in Round 2 2012 at Prospect when South (119) defeated North (104). The first match North was part of a game when both clubs cleared over 100 points was in Round 6, 1932 when Port 16.15 (111) defeated North 17.8 (110) by 1 point. Ken Farmer kicked 12.4 in the loss.

### 5. SANFL MATTERS

Malcolm Ellis provided the members an update on SANFL matters:

- SANFL have agreed to recognise some issues and conduct a full review of their football programs and operations, including a focus on the SANFL competition.
- Objective is to understand where it should position itself in the football landscape, as it relates to the AFL and the Amateur League
- Directors and Clubs have put pressure on the SANFL to place far more attention of where the competition is going and how to best structure itself to ensure it goes for another 150 years.
- A subcommittee is being formed and Malcolm Ellis has been nominated to fill one of those sub committee roles

# 6. FINANCIAL REPORT

In the absence of Mr Pat Hodby, G. Edwards provided a presentation on the Clubs 2017 financial performance. Key points were:

- 2017 result was a profit of \$122,453 which was \$252,967 less than the previous profit result. Very difficult year in venue performance, in particular gaming at the Northern Tavern, a result of the impact of the Regency Plaza Centre sale
- 2017 earnings before interest, taxes, depreciation and amortisation was \$807,125, which decreased by \$231,270 compared to 2016 results.
- •2017 debt level \$1.81 million (2016 was \$2.10 million), again, critical for the club to continue to reduce debt aggressively.
- 2017 debt reduction was \$292,425 (2015 was \$480,372).
- $\bullet$  2017 Team Maintenance (senior football costs) was \$1,025K (\$1,026K in 2016).
- 2017 Consolidated Profit at \$677K (2016 was \$897K).
- 2017 Consolidated Net Assets \$4.168 million (2016 \$4.297 million)
- Net gaming operations at Northern Tavern decreased by \$340K
- $\bullet$  Net gaming operations at Grand North decreased by \$104K due to industry trend reduction following gaming legislation change to \$5 max bet.
- Food and Bar at Grand North up by \$25K over 2016
- 2017 Corporate Partnerships (sponsors) at NAFC were up by \$30K

Q: Who is our No 1 ruckman this year, with James Craig out? A: Alex Barns will be the first ruck in round 1 as Jordon Sweet is suspended for first 2 rounds.

# Q: How many players have left the club?

A: Quite a few, around 8-10. The list has continued to evolve into the list we think we need to start building success. We needed to add some speed and kicking skills which we have done and we have a number of young NAFC juniors who will take their place this season.

# Q: What are your realistic goals in 2018?

A: The goal every year is to come top. Our aim is to ensure we win enough games to play finals football. Then, we will reassess and set new goals.

Q: Have we gone after other ruckman from the AFL, like Daniel Currie and Mark Jamar?

A: We have spoken to Currie a few times over the past 2 years, he has settled back in Melbourne. We are confident our ruck stocks are OK. We have developing rucks like Sweet, OBorn and Denham all coming along.

Q: Was Ramsey reported in the Fast Footy? A: Yes he was, but it was thrown out.

# 12. GENERAL BUSINESS

Mr W. Jeffries opened the floor for general business questions:

Q: Darryl Mansbridge – I want to congratulate the club on its excellent facilities for disabled at Prospect Oval. It is the best oval in the SANFL for allowing wheelchairs to move around freely, all other grounds are much worse, and some are impossible for the disabled.

A: Thanks Darryl, it is certainly something the SANFL must rectify.

Q: Shannon Morrissey: With Sturt FC now able to make over \$400K profit after being broke and bottom for a few years, are the clubs talking to each other on how to improve each other in terms of the financial performance of each club, with so many struggling?

A: Sturt FC have developed a sustainable football model off field after off loading the Castle Tavern a few years ago. This is what was creating the huge losses for them, and the lease they were tied to made it very difficult to get out. Now they are out, they have been able to return the profitability, and with the backing of their large membership, VP group and match attendances, have been able to minimise the need for gaming revenue, unlike all other clubs. Yes, the clubs do talk about assisting each other.

Q: Can the SANFL Clubs join forces regards club finances? A: SANFL puts together meetings and forums for Directors to discuss the issues of each club and the competition. They are very open and sharing discussions between the clubs, but perhaps not so open with the SANFL. This can be frustrating and one of the reasons the clubs have pushed for the review of the SANFL's operations.

Q: Stuart Lawson: Can we change the Northern Tavern bottleshop back into a drive thru?

A: The bottleshop was created because of the smoking legislation in 2008 and will be unlikely to ever be a drive thru again.

### Q: Does every club adhere to the salary cap?

A: It is very hard to show disrespect to the other clubs, so not for me to say. I know at NAFC we do adhere to the salary cap, but one thing is for sure, many community clubs do not follow the salary cap guidelines they operate under which places much pressure on SANFL clubs to retain players.

Q: Congrats to all the speakers tonight, has been very interesting. One question, do the Board have people in the country zone looking for new kids?

A: Yes we do, we have several experience people looking at games for the club throughout our zone, as well as outside our zone. W. Jeffries travels to the country zone several times per year as does Neil Sanders, often meeting with people who understand the types of players we are looking for. We also hold country camps and have academies operating throughout.

Q: Would the Board consider changing back to old 'cock of the north' logo and get rid of the current logo, which I don't really know what it is supposed to be?

A: We will take your feedback on board.

# 2018 GRAND FINAL FACTS:

None of the 21 players who played in the Grand Final played in North's last Grand Final appearance in 2013. Max Thring was injured in the Preliminary Final and James Craig and Leigh Ryswyk, who played in 2013, played in North Reserves Premiership this year.

Jake Wohling's 4 league games to become a premiership player is surprisingly not a record for North. Henry 'Harry' Mumme (1900) and Sidney 'Sid' Burton (1930) both played in a North premiership in their second match. Jake's four games places him 3rd, Jordon Sweet is =10th with eight games and Boyd Woodcock is =13th with 9 games.

Boyd Woodcock is the 5th youngest North Premiership Player. The youngest (known) is Hall of Famer Ernest 'Ernie' Johns (18 years, 14 days) in 1902. Boyd's (18 years, 202 days) sits 5th and Connor Rozee (18 years, 244 days) has him equal 7th with another Hall of Famer and former captain Don Gilbourne in 1949.

In 1991 North had seven players who were recruited from other clubs, in 2018 we had eight.




