Phillips Tribute

The Football Budget would like to take this opportunity to add its voice in tribute to former North Adelaide star John Phillips who was killed



after being hit by a car last Saturday night. Phillips played for North from 1962 to 1974, chiefly at centre win, totalling 77 games, including the Roosters 1971 and 1972 premierships. A resourceful, direct

player he also represented South Australia five times including the Hobart Carnival in 1966. He acted as the league runner for the past two seasons.

As a mark of respect today North Adelaide president Mr. Kelly Baker will ask patrons and players to observe twenty seconds silence prior to the start of the league game against Norwood. North players will also be wearing black arm bands."

1920**

"The keen feeling between Torrens and Port drove the Port barrackers into the North camp on Saturday; Ports have a rather friendly regard for North, whom they supported solidly in last season's final, and admire for their fair methods in the recent contest between them which decided the minor premiership. Solid barracking for North came from some Sturt players and officials, who last year rejoiced at their narrow win over North in the Premiership contest. Owen Beatty, Whitehead, Bruce, and Golding, with Secretary Tank, were delighted with the victory of the red and whites, and Golding was one of the first to congratulate Leahy on his side's win."

Heathy (Heath) stood up in only his 3rd senior game against an experienced player in Herbert. To single out a few seems unfair for it was a real team effort last Saturday.

On the injury front our thoughts go out to Roey (Roe) and Wakes (Wakelin) who will spend up to 6 weeks on the sidelines. They have played very well this year for us, and will need someone to step up to fill their roles while they are out. Coult's (Coulter) also was injured, but I don't expect him to be out for too long" – Andrew Jarman (Senior Coach)."

BIG BEN SWAP CARD PROMOTION BOOMING

The huge demand for Big Ben footy posters and swap cards has forced a reprint of the popular posters.

Associated Baking Corporation (SA), the selected supplier of Big Ben pies and pasties to Football Park boasted record sales in the first week of the promotion.

After the third week of the promotion, stocks of the 15,000 initial print run of the poster are quickly running out and additional stock will be rushed into the league football clubs to cater for the demand.

The posters, produced for each of the 10 league clubs feature an action photograph, the club logo and player profile information about the six players whose photographs can be collected and pasted to the poster.

Glen Morelli of Cheltenham created havoc at Football Park a few weeks ago when he arrived at the collection point with 300 coupons. Fortunately he only asked for a set of 10 posters but still needed the 360 swap cards that he was entitled to.

To obtain a team poster and six swap cards, five coupons from the Big Ben pie bags must be collected and exchanged at any League club and Football Park.

Last week North entered the five for the first time in three years. And if its selectors can pick from a static squad, to maintain consistency, North will be seen at Football Park in September.

"North Adelaide captain Don Lindner played his 225th league game and broke Ken Farmer's club record by leading his team to an overwhelming win over a tentative Central District... And there was no half-measure either. He sustained his brilliant form with another best-on-ground performance which featured spectacular high marking over packs and raking dropkicks in his inimitable style... But Lindner did everything right even to the extent of giving North first use of the wind by winning the toss" – *The Advertiser*

FOOTBALL FINAL BRILLIANT Farmer's New Record AFTER THE MATCH

Features of a brilliant finale to the football season on Saturday in which North Adelaide won from Sturt by 17.13 to 11.11, were a record crowd for the season of 34,202, and that Farmer, of North, brought his total of goals this year to 126—two better than the Australian record of Gordon Coventry, of Colingwood, Victoria.

There was an excited scene in North's dressing-room after the game. Thoughts of all else were abandoned for mutual congratulations, and to shower felicitations on Farmer. Players and supporters crowded the tables, the benches, and even sat on top of the lockers. The doorkeeper vainly tried to regulate their entry, but his efforts were not equal to the pressure of those outside, and he was forced to let them flow in promiscuously.
