"South Australian Football Budget" – Saturday 24 June 1995

"The North Adelaide Football Club and the S.A.N.F.L. have been saddened to learn that Harold 'Dribbler' Hawke has passed away, aged 85. The former star centreman won the 1937 Magarey Medal in the only full season of league football he played, and was the League's oldest surviving Magarey Medallist. It is understood he was the only player ever chosen in a State side when not playing league (he was playing country football at the time!). Harold was born in Prospect in 1909, played 70 games for North from 1927 until 1940, and continued to play for Curramulka on the Yorke Peninsula for another decade."


Bouquet For Robran

The advertisement featured all club captains but Rodney's preparation was far from ideal.

On Monday night he underwent knee surgery at 5.15 p.m. and was picked up from hospital at 10 a.m. on Tuesday by his wife and whisked straight to the Prospect Oval where he donned his red and white Guernsey.

Needless to say Rodney's part in the commercial was not an over active one."

Power / Port Adelaide Magpies Issue



More Than 100 Goals For Fifth Successive Year

For the fifth successive season K. Farmer (North Adelaide) has kicked more than a hundred goals. This feat is unapproached in the Australian rules games. On Saturday he kicked 13 goals in the mud to bring his total to 106—his best total for a minor round, with the exception of 1931 (his Australian record year), when he kicked 109 before the semi-finals. Farmer finished this season with a wonder-
