

**Comments**: Lock's 50<sup>th</sup> game and Farmer's 100<sup>th</sup> goal for the season (including his 150<sup>th</sup> total goals); "The outstanding feature of the game was the goalkicking of Farmer. He scored 15 goals to bring his total to 101 for the season. Several of his majors were secured as a result of interference. At times 3 men were appointed to watch him" - The Mail;

Records broken: Farmer kicked all North's goals except for the 6<sup>th</sup> 16<sup>th</sup> and 17<sup>th</sup> including kicking the first 5, 10 out of the 11 at three-quarter time, and 14 out of the first 15 goals; It was also his second bag of double figure haul in as many weeks, his 3<sup>rd</sup> in the past four games, bringing a total of 44 goals in the last four matches; Farmer's 15 goals was also the most kicked in a match since the introduction of the SANFL in 1907.

At Prospect Oval yesterday the duo's abilities almost reached out and touched genius. More than any, they inspired North Adelaide to a whopping 160-point victory... Just take a glance at their statistics. Hart, whose physical presence is the embodiment of a determine, combative football personality, finished with 36 kicks, nine marks, 21 handballs and six goals. And Jarman, who at his dazzling best can elevate the game to an art form, picked up 32 kicks, six marks, 14 handballs and 3.2. They were simply magnificent..." – Sunday Mail
