CEO'S REPORT GREG EDWARDS

SEASON 2020

The only sure thing from this year is that we will all remember the year 2020. It was tough for everyone, we all shared in the emotional, financial and personal difficulties suffered by our family, friends, colleagues and all those we never knew. COVID-19 came through our streets, neighbourhoods and suburbs and threatened to change life as we know it forever.

Firstly, and most importantly, I would like to personally thank everyone who has touched the NAFC in 2020, from our Board, to staff, players, coaches, support staff, volunteers, suppliers, Partners, Council, bank, landlords and especially our members and supporters. It was all of you that ensured our Club got through the year and was able to plan a future at the end of it.

As we know, until early June, there wasn't going to be a football season, but by late June, we were playing Round 1 at Adelaide Oval. This is how fast things were moving, and how flexible we all needed to be. We had to contend with a new electronic ticketing process which was uncomfortable for some members, contact tracing mechanisms for all games and functions, ever changing COVID directions for capacities, drinking whilst seated only, social distancing and uncompromising hygiene standards. It was one hell of a way to kick off a new season!

I have said this before, but I am really proud of our Club for its commitment to continuing to be dedicated and focused on success despite the tough year. Our players and coaches across the board remained steadfast in their passion and commitment to be successful, even when the odds were stacked against them.

To cut a long story short, as there are many stories from 2020, our season as a Club was outstanding. Our League side fell short in the last game of the year, but we achieved so much throughout the year, highlighted by an undefeated Premiership season by our Women's team, including having the SANFLW Best and Fairest winner (Anne Hatchard), the SANFLW Leading Goalkicker (Ashleigh Woodland), the Young Player of the Year (Hannah Ewings) and the Coach of the Year (Krissie Steen). In addition, we had the 2020 SANFL Magarey Medallist (Campbell Combe), the Reserves Magarey Medallist (Dakota Nixon) and the Young Player of the Year (Will Combe). Our new recruits such as Andrew Moore, Will Combe, Kym LeBois, Billy Hartung, Cam Hewett and Harrison Wigg all played key roles in our success in 2020, and all will be even better in 2021.

In our League side, we did get the opportunity to see some exciting new players make their debut including Harrison Magor, Patrick Davies, Will Combe and Damon Hill, all showing they can play at the higher level.

Senior Coach Jacob Surjan and his coaches have delivered a football program which placed our Club at the forefront of the competition. Our fitness and injury prevention strategies were exceptional, our players approached each training session and game with a focus on improvement and moving the Club forward and our football department staff were committed to getting the job done.

The same applies to our Women's Team Senior Coach Krissie Steen and her coaches. They prepared our playing group to achieve success, and if you had the opportunity of watching their matches, you will agree they were a level above most of their opponents all season, thoroughly deserving the ultimate success of an undefeated season and Premiership.

Normally it's easy to pick out people for special thanks, but truly, special thanks goes out to everyone involved in our 2020 year. We were humbled by the support we received on our ASF donation page, we were humbled by how our corporate partners backed us despite their own financial issues. Our members and supporters stayed the journey with us, our staff were immense when we needed them to be, and on field we gave it everything!

Have a great summer and let's get ready for a big 2021!

CORPORATE PARTNERSHIPS 2020

Once COVID-19 hit us in March, the Club was facing a future of unknown expectations and outcomes. With the season postponed, venues closed and staff stood down, it was a time we needed to lean on those who have shown us great support throughout our journey.

In a crisis you often learn very quickly where the support will come from, and in 2020, we did that. Our corporate partners/sponsors were faced with the same unknowns as we were, yet they threw their support behind our great Club and made sure we were OK. There were many difficult conversations around how we could work together to provide value to each other in an environment which wasn't offering too many opportunities.

With the season coming back in late June, the advent of a 14-game season and seemingly coming out of the COVID nightmare, together we created those opportunities and the mutual benefits surfaced. There were many learnings from 2020, good and bad, but one of the nicest and most pleasing were the relationships and connections built with the best group of corporate partners in sport!

We fell slightly short of our target, but the outcome was more than expected. We could not have asked for more, and for that, we congratulate all corporate partners for allowing our Club to emerge with strength.

Again, a special thank you again goes out to our President's Group Committee for their continued commitment and support for our Corporate Partnerships, often connecting and involving our Partners in their fundraising programs, whether it be the TTG Golf Day, Home Match luncheons, or any other function or event.

We have the best Major Partner in the SANFL with Copyworld Toshiba and once again, the support of David Morris and his team has been vital in our ability to fund critical areas in our operations such as junior development, country zone academies and the female football programs.

MEMBERSHIP

Club Membership levels in 2020 finished slightly below 2019. Remarkably, our membership reached 2,055 this year (2,183 in 2019), after all the uncertainties faced by our members throughout 2020.

Despite the hardship among our members, they remained committed ensuring their Club remained relevant and sustainable. Whilst our membership, particularly with the advent of the Digital Pass, has remained stable for a few years, our objective is to grow membership to 2,500 over the next few years.

This means we need to be consistently offering value to our membership, with high performances on field and real connection to the Club off field. Members remain our lifeblood and our future depends on retaining and growing our membership numbers, enabling us to continue to develop our football programs, for boys and girls, into the future.

NORTHERN TAVERN AND GRAND NORTH

Safe to say it was a difficult year for our two venues. COVID took away 3 months of trading completely, and the constant threat of new COVID directions and regulation amendments impacted on our patron numbers for the second half of our financial year.

In saying that, we were able to utilize the Job Keeper subsidy for our employees, effectively allowing us to resume business at the end of June. For both venues, we showed solid financial results at the end of October, largely due to Job Keeper, but also due to the COVID Protocols for leases and rents, and the decision by the SA Government to defer the payment of Gaming Tax. For the Northern Tavern, this meant for April, May and June, we were able to have our rent waived and deferred, and also amended through the July, August and September period to some degree. Regarding Gaming Tax, the tax due for March, June, July and August for both Grand North and the Northern Tavern was deferred and is to be paid back by instalments through 2021.

These factors alone enabled us to generate an above budget financial result for this FY, although as mentioned, much of it is to be paid back and become more visible in 2021.

In a difficult environment our venue leaders shone again! With Kate Inkster out on maternity leave from March, Jim Fenwick stepped into the Manager's role at the Northern Tavern and did a great job. He also took on the bar managers role at Prospect Oval in Kate's absence and again, was fantastic. Kate has a great team at the Tavern, and it was great to see Jim, Steve, John and others step up and take it on.

Grand North, with its older demographic, was hit hard by the COVID directions, our dining business has suffered from a reduction in numbers since March. We were doing around 1,500 meals per week up to March, falling to around 1,200 from September. Head Chef Dave Wilcox and Venue Manager Tania Hubbard have done a great job in retaining such high numbers through the venue, when many venues have suffered much bigger losses.

A special mention to Tania, who departed at the end of November to venture off into the wilderness in her caravan with husband John. Both have been extremely hard workers in their field, and the thought of relaxing and taking a well-earned rest was too much!

Our new Venue Manager at Grand North is Debbie Delfos, who has been Tania's assistant for many years. Debbie brings a wealth of experience and passion to the role, and we look forward to being part of her journey in 2021.

LOOKING AHEAD

Amazingly, financially, we finished the year with surplus cash in the bank. As mentioned above, there were many reasons why we did, and much of that cash surplus will be used in 2021 on payment deferrals, including the Prospect Council loan for which we graciously received a deferment of 12 months by the Council. We were very grateful for the Council's support with this; it enabled us to plan 2020 without the need to service the loan.

Whilst each venue posted an above budget result, the financial stress will be more visible in 2021 as we repay the deferred payments of 2020 and take up the capital needs from Government gaming legislation changes and the machine upgrades required for us to continue to compete. We have received less than 50% of our normal SANFL distribution payment in 2020, and this will remain so in 2021. In response to that, the salary cap for players has been slashed by nearly 50% due to the absence of these typical revenue streams.

So, planning for the future is slightly more complex than it normally is, but it is at these times when the cream rises to the top. We are very confident of our position, on and off the field, and are approaching the New Year with great energy and enthusiasm!

Look forward to an exciting 2021 as we again head TRUENORTH!



PRESIDENT'S REPORT ANDREW SOUTER

Whilst the year 2020 will more than likely go down in history as being one to forget, noting the emergence of Covid-19, it's been a very strong year for the North Adelaide Football Club.

Following the conclusion of season 2019, senior coach Jacob Surjan & football manager Darryl Wintle worked tirelessly to identify and contact significant players of interest in an effort to bring them to Prospect Oval. Those efforts saw the return of the highly talented Andrew Moore, Harrison Wigg, Kym LeBois, Robbie Young and Will Combe, along with significant additions, Billy Hartung, Cameron Hewett, Elliot Chalmers & Sam Parsons.

Our junior development program once again produced an exciting batch of young players, with Frank Szekely, Keanu Miller, Karl Finlay & Dyson Hilder all having exceptional seasons this year.

We have been fortunate to retain all those who played in the league grand final this year, however, we do say farewell to player favourite Chris Barns. On the new additions front and at the time of writing, our most recent appointment for season 2021 is Aaron Young from the Gold Coast Suns.

In regard to our coaching staff for 2021 and with exception to Trent Mills who steps down for family reasons, we've been successful in retaining all coaches for season 2021. Trent has been a fantastic asset to our club over the past three seasons and we wish him well. We are also extremely pleased to once again retain the services of Jay Collison as the Head of our Strength and Conditioning Program for 2021.

Season 2020 saw coach Surjan rotate 32 players at league level, including four who made their league debut and nine who made their club debut. Recent surgeries for Cameron Craig (pectoral muscle) and Jarred Allmond (ankle) have taken place and both eagerly await their return to training.

Whilst our grand final losses at both league and reserves levels are disappointing, we're left heartened by the very talented list coach Jacob Surjan and football manager Darryl Wintle have built this year. This list of course will only be further strengthened by off-season additions, including Aaron Young from the Gold Coast Suns.

In recent weeks of course, we've celebrated with Campbell Combe who won the SANFL League Magarey Medal, his brother Will who won the SANFL Powerade Breakthrough Player of the Year award, the inclusion of players Campbell Combe, Andrew Moore, Harrison Wigg and Cameron Craig in the SANFL team of the year, Dakota Nixon winning the League Reserves Magarey Medal, Krissie Steen and her Women's team winning the Women's League Premiership & Anne Hatchard winning the Women's Medal.

In the above respect, I'd say that most football Clubs across the country would dearly love to celebrate the level of success our Club has enjoyed this year.

On the administration front, I'd like to offer my sincere thanks and gratitude to our CEO, Greg Edwards. We've endured an awful year as human beings (in relation to COVID-19) and Greg has been an absolute rock throughout this period.

Like many other businesses across the world, our income streams ground to an immediate halt when our State was shut down in March 2020. As a responsible and diligent Board however, we met on day one, implementing swift action which ultimately preserved the jobs of many of our loyal workers. In that regard, my great thanks and respect goes to each of my fellow Board members, who like me, embraced modern technology in order to meet "virtually", to discuss the complexities of COVID-19 and to plot the financial direction of our Club. We did this during the hospitalisation period and ultimate passing of our beloved Club President, Lee Virgin.

Some of the administrative points of interest and achievements made during this period was;

A larger than normal cash balance of circa \$2.2 million due to;

- Securing a three-month rent-free period at the Tavern
- Deferral of our Council loan facility payments for 12 months (approximately \$264,000)
- Deferral of gaming tax for 4 months (approximately \$400,000)
- License fee waiver at Grand North (approximately \$36,000)
- Securing a Job Keeper subsidy of circa \$1.2 million over six months for 30 employees and 38 players and coaches, noting that no player payments were made during the season

Revenue reductions in 2020 in the form of;

- Receipt of only 50% of SANFL distribution (\$350,000)
- No land divestment funds received (\$275,000)
- Closure of our venues for three months (loss of food, wastage)
- Cancellation of our Gala dinner, Sportsman's lunch, Sponsor functions and several small third-party functions
- Noting the Board evaluation by ISC, specifically around portfolios, Board charter and duty statements
- And last and far from least, the significant reduction to the salary cap from \$410,000 per annum to \$210,000 per annum

The finance committee, a subcommittee of the Board itself, has a few projects of significance for 2021 including, renegotiating our loan facility with Council and securing funds to redevelop our Club facilities, including transformation of the pavilion into a dining and function space, relocation of the kitchen and gymnasium and addition of change rooms for our women's team.

Finally, I would like to offer my sincere gratitude and thanks to both our sponsors and members who have stuck with us during this awful, awful year. We are blessed by having, in my opinion, the best group of sponsors in the league, which is highlighted by our major sponsor Copyworld and others re-committing for season 2021.

Looking forward to a big 2021 for the Mighty Roosters.

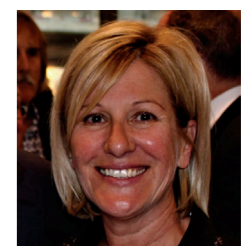

PRESIDENT'S GROUP REPORT

CHRIS MCSPORRAN

The purpose of the President's Group is to raise funds for the Club and to support the development of our players. 2020 has been the most extraordinary roller coaster year. The optimism of a new coach and playing list, the uncertainty of a season proceeding at all, the tragic passing of our President Lee Virgin, the joy of a Women's premiership, Best and Fairest winner of the competition, Men's finals campaign and a Margery Medallist; and the disappointment of a Grand Final loss.

Through all this, the membership and contribution of the PG's remained resolute. In April and May when a football season looked a remote possibility, not one financial member asked for a reimbursement. 2019 members continued to pay-up and new members joined. On top of this, numerous PG members made additional contributions through the Australian Sports Foundation initiative.

The Committee's focus for 2020 was to support the Board in whatever ways possible to assist the Club through the COVID crisis, hence the requests from the football department this year were limited to:

- Player sponsored functions - \$3,200
- Best and Fairest Night (trophies and player meals) - \$5,000

The surplus for the season after the above distributions was \$38,000. Such an extraordinary result was achieved due to the great support of players and sponsors to stick with the golf day which was rescheduled from March to October and the near sell-out of our 7-home match luncheons.

The 2021 Committee will work with the football department to agree how the Group's retained earnings can be applied over the next few years to give our players the best opportunity for success.

The offering at our lunches throughout the season continued the Club's high reputation for hospitality and thanks to the bar and kitchen teams for the service standards provided to members and their guests. Thanks to the players and coaches for their insights at various lunches and to our guest speakers over the season John Roberts, Peter Darley, Tony Symonds, Peter Cloke and Peter Krieg. Thanks also to John Mitchell for the supply of statistics and other pieces of information about guests.

Whilst the financial performance for 2020 was exceptional, and the membership increase again welcomed; COVID has hit the SANFL competition significantly. The next two years will be financially challenging for the competition and North Adelaide. To maintain the financial viability of the Club and President's Group, a further increase in membership and fundraising is required. The Committee welcomes any Rooster supporter who wishes to join a like-minded, passionate coterie group. For a small outlay; friendship, networking and business opportunities are awaiting new members. Please contact either myself or the Club if you would like to join the President's Group.

Special thanks to CEO Greg Edwards and the administration team in the most dramatic of years and the PG Committee and Golf Committee for their support and assistance in making things happen.

There is an old saying "Don't wish your life away" but the end of 2020 cannot come quick enough. Let's hope 2021 brings new opportunities for fun and success at North Adelaide.

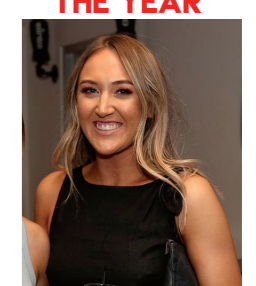

OBITUARY

During the Period of 1 November 2019 to 31 October 2020, the North Adelaide Football Club mourned the loss of Life Members Bob Odgers, Marta Payne and Don Snow. We sadly lost Player Life Members John Blunden, Don Gilbourne, Bob Hammond, Bill Blunden and George Donisthorpe. We also lost Past Players Mike Doszna, Gary Forrest, Alan Galloway, Kevin Lovie and Neil Sachse.

In July Club President Lee Virgin passed away. A life-long Rooster supporter like his father before him, Lee was a founding member of the Prospectors Group in the 1980's, a coterie of other like-minded NAFC members, a long-standing member of the Presidents Group, a Board member and our Club's President.

The Board, Staff and Players would also like to extend their deepest sympathy to all who had loved ones pass during the year. The Club uses its best endeavours to maintain current records. Please accept our apologies if any detail is overlooked. Any assistance in ensuring our records are current would be greatly appreciated.

HISTORY COMMITTEE REPORT

This year marked the 20th anniversary of the formation of the History Committee. From humble beginnings the Committee has achieved beyond our wildest expectations, thanks to the tireless efforts of so many wonderful volunteers and great support from our current CEO. One of our first tasks was to establish a catalogue of the memorabilia in the Club's possession. From a holding of about 100 items in that initial stage, we now have over 10,000 items (photos, footballs, medals, trophies, badges etc.) in our archives!

Most of our plans for the year were thwarted by the COVID-19 pandemic, particularly because the Club's financial position left no funding for other than essential items. In particular, we were unable to hold any of our normal functions for past players nor to celebrate the 100th anniversary of our 1920 premiership. It is hoped to organise the latter celebration in 2021.

However, later in the year we were able to help organise a reunion of our 1970 Colts premiership team in conjunction with a President's Group luncheon and the highlight of the year was an afternoon tea for the surviving players who represented the Club in our premiership year of 1960. This was held on 1 October, exactly 60 years from the date of the Grand Final, and was so enjoyed by those who could attend that we have been asked to organise a get-together for that group annually – a request that we will be very pleased to meet. Due to COVID-19 restrictions it was not possible to invite members to join this event.

Our Club can trace its history back to 1881 when a group of College students formed a Club called Medindie and played matches in the nearby parklands. The area where they played these games, known as Hawker's Paddock, therefore has special significance to us and after representations to the Adelaide City Council by Committee member Nick Haines, an interpretive board was developed and installed to mark this spot.

The large display cabinet in the main hall was utilised by Julie Vranek and Colin Richardson to exhibit the various indigenous jumpers that we have worn in recent years as well as a monthly display of players from each of the decades 1980s, 1990s and 2000s.

I would like to record my gratitude to those who donated memorabilia to the Club during the year and to the members of the History Committee for their continued hard work and dedication in what has been a very difficult year for us all. WOMEN'S TEAM COACH'S REPORT KRISSIE STEEN

2020 Season was definitely one for the history books in many ways. It came with it's challenges, but greater success. Coming in as the new Senior Women's coach, I also had to engage a new Coaching Team, Team Managers, High Performance Manager and an additional trainer.

We were extremely lucky with the quality of the personnel who joined us for the ride. Not just excellent at their jobs, but brilliant human beings – which makes having fun, while working hard, much easier.

We then went on to a rigorous recruitment process where we held three separate trials and then staged our Squad finalisation into three stages, the final elimination being in January. We wanted to allow players showing potential the opportunity to train with us for a while before deciding if they were at NAFCW level for 2020.

It proved a very successful method and from it we secured some brilliant new additions into the Squad like Katelyn Pope, Lauren Gauci, Erin Sundstrom & Charlea Taylor, who all played in the Grand Final team.

It was great to bolster our list with experienced transferring players Kristi Harvey, Mollie McKendrick, Tayla Gordon & Stana Zecevic.

There was a focus to grow our Zone and we made great efforts to attract talent from the North. We saw Bek Rasheed (Mick Redden's daughter) ruck every game; Kate Case; Hannah Ewings and Jorja Eldridge all make their debuts in the White V. In our Round 1 Game we had 11 debutants.

The new squad members coupled with the existing talented list gave us a confidence heading into pre-season that we were going to be strong. 2020 was to be our year of greatness and we chased this in everything that we did. Nothing, no task, no training, no moment was considered small – everything was an opportunity to be better or do better. I think this showed in the end and is a credit to every single person who was involved in the Women's program

The pre-season went well. We trained the girls hard physically and mentally. Collectively we made a decision that we would play a very daring & exciting brand of football. That we would show that we were skilled by foot and take risks to make the game more of a spectacle to watch.

By the time we reached trial matches it was evident that we were where we had planned to be. We still had much to learn & build on, but the development was evident and the players were on the same page regarding the game-plan & attitude to contested ball.

Unfortunately, tragedy struck in our first trial match against Glenelg and we lost starting defender Sarah Ellis to an ACL injury.

It was a blow to us all but luckily it was the only season-ending injury we got all year.

In the first 4 Rounds the Roosters strutted their stuff and we were the first team to beat South Adelaide at Noarlunga since South started in the competition in 2018. We finished Pre-Covid at the top of the ladder. Then we hit the uncertainty of Covid and everything went on hold.

We made the decision that we wouldn't stop during the Covid shut down, so the girls had running and gym programs; plus online group challenges and online Zoom fitness sessions. The coaches also put together solo skills programs for the players to do.

When the season restarted we came out of the Covid-off-season fit and strong. We were also bolstered by the return of our AFLW girls in Britt Perry, Talia Radan and Anne Hatchard. Given we already had Ash Woodland, who had opted to leave the Melbourne Football Club and have a season at home with the Roosters, we looked good, scoring 83pts to Sturt's 6pts and Anne Hatchard getting 42 touches in her debut in the white V.

The games rolled on in a similar fashion with us going for 11 straight quarters without a team scoring a goal against us. Our defence was on fire. Our achilles heel loomed as being our ability to impact the scoreboard as we scored 17 behinds in our final game of the season!

Albeit we finished the normal season undefeated with 599 points for and 135 points against and a percentage of 81.65.

We were proud, but knew we had to reset and keep striving to be better until the end.

From there we hit the finals series and faced South Adelaide in the Semi-Final. It was a tight contest but we came away with the win. It was a full team effort with plenty of incredible performances, the tank of Hatchard proved a massive asset, Harvey's brilliance in the backline and Perry's class and smarts up front damaged the scoreboard.

One game to go...

The Roosters had a great following on Grand Final Day and the crowd was glowing red. There were number restrictions and many people were unable to get in to watch the game.

Our change rooms were decorated from top to toe with photos and memories of the year – Deb Curtis and Terry Howe went all out to make it a special day for the girls.

Our banner was sensational and the icing on the cake for the girls as they busted through the words "Dare Greatly – History Awaits" It was another tight contest against South Adelaide but we went out with fire in our bellies to own the third quarter, even with the wind against us. We got two goals up and maintained a lead until the final siren went.

It's the first time since Port Adelaide in 1914 that a team has won an undefeated Premiership in a SANFL competition. All of the North Adelaide Football Club should be proud of that.

Adding to the premiership we won every single award in the SANFLW competition:

Best & Fairest – Anne Hatchard (also Runner up Best & Fairest – Katelyn Pope), Coaches Player – Anne Hatchard, Leading Goal Kicker – Ash Woodland, Rising Star – Hannah Ewings and Coach of the Year - Krissie Steen.

Due to their incredible performances we have 3 Roosters flying the coop; Ash Woodland (Adelaide Crows); Lauren Gauci & Amber ward (West Coast Eagles).

It was one very, very long season. We started in Sept 2019 and finished in August 2020.

But it was worth it.

One thing that will remain with me from this year is seeing Scott, the owner of Action Line Marking (the Womens Major Sponsor), at every game. The one commodity that can never be replaced is someones time, he supported us with his money AND his time every week. #TrueNorth

North Adelaide's 2020 season finally got underway in the last week of June due to the COVID-19 pandemic under a new Coach, new Captain and limited attendance in a double header at Adelaide Oval. North faced West in an entertaining battle which was a wrestle for control in the first half before a settled North broke away for a comfortable victory in the second. Early game jitters, no doubt due to the inclusion of a number of new players and Moore's return game – his first for North since 2013. Chalmers, Hewett and Wigg (in his 50th SANFL game) played their first game for North whilst W. Combe, Hartung and Lebois played their first SANFL match. With Wigg (27 disposals) and Allmond (21 touches) producing smooth long-kicking clearances out of defence, C. Craig controlling the air (11 marks) on our last line of defence and our midfield core of Moore (25 disposals), Hartung (19) and Schwarz (22) along with Hewett's 13 crushing tackles created plenty of goal opportunities ahead. JUNIOR FOOTBALL DEVELOPMENT REPORT

Due to COVID, 2020 was almost a complete wipe-out for programs run by our SANFL Development Officers Jason Rivett (Metro.) and Craig Oliphant (Country).

Metropolitan
Auskick was one of the few programs to commence but numbers dropped by over 500 as Centres ran at different times of the year, and many were not able to start.

The SANFL ran a merged school football competition where only one of our schools participated.

Mini League and Little League (at AFL games) did not go ahead.

The success story was the SANFL Juniors, where we had almost 100% participation levels of the previous year. This was the only metro. Junior competition in Australia to get going and although it was a slightly reduced program, full credit to those involved in ensuring our juniors had the opportunity to play.

Country
Female football has become a focus in our country zone and fortunately the competition run in February and March at Crystal Brook went ahead. There were 3 teams in the Under 16 Competition and 8 in the Over 16's.

With netball not going ahead in Port Augusta, some keen, enthusiastic people set up a 'come & try' competition. There were two teams in the Under 11, 13 and 16 age groups. It is expected that the NAFC Junior Carnival will resume again next year.

All three Leagues / Associations in our zone went ahead with reduced programs; however in two, one team in each chose not to participate.

Like metro, Auskick numbers were down and there was also no opportunity to participate in Mini League or Little League. The talent programs also were also affected.

Country:
Training squads at Laura, Port Augusta, Port Pirie and Whyalla ran during the summer months with an Under 16 weekend camp at Melrose in February.
Under 16 and Under 18 Country v Metro Games went ahead but with Central Oval Port Augusta being renovated and no other ovals available in the Country they were played at X Convenience Oval Elizabeth this year.
Unfortunately the Under 14 Carnival scheduled for late May did not happen, but we were able to hold the Under 15 Carnival (normally at Jamestown on the Monday of the June Long weekend) at Port Oval Port Pirie on Sunday August 30.
The traditional Under 14/15 Country v Metro games also were not able to be held this year.

SANFL were able to reschedule the Under 15 Championships to the second week of the October school holidays so both Country and Metro. Teams were participated in that. However, the Under 17 Youth which is normally played alongside those teams did not occur.

Metro:
Our Under 13, 14, & 15 Development Squads only had very reduced programs commencing early September.
The Under 13 and Under 14 Squads were able to play games against Norwood in the first week of the October holidays, while the Under 15's participated in the Under 15 Championships the following week.
Our Under 18 team almost got in a full season play 14 games and just missing the finals in the last game of the year
The Under 16's were undefeated after two games before the season was abandoned and were well on track to playing in a Grand Final
We were able to hold our two Junior Advisory Meetings in the Country, but our metro. club representatives were only able to attend one meeting before these were put on hold. These meetings allow all stakeholders to have an input into the programs we run in the respective areas.

There were no National Under 16 or Under 18 Championships this year.
The good news is we appear on track to resume all our programs next year.
The Club extends a massive thank you to the many Coaches and support staff who have assisted across the various programs, this year not receiving anything in return for their countless hours. We are blessed with the group of volunteers we have, whose primary focus is to ensure we give our juniors the best opportunities moving forward.

CAMPBELL COMBE 2020 MAGAREY MEDAL

Campbell Combe became North Adelaide's 17th Magarey Medallist and 23rd medal giving the Club their first since James Allan won his 3rd in 2011. The win places the Club one medal behind Port Adelaide's SANFL record of 24. It was also 50 years since Barrie Robran's 2nd Medal in 1970 and 70 years since Ian McKay won his in 1950! Campbell also joined the list of North Medallists who had a brother also play for North: Leahy, Pash, Lindner, Robran, Jarman.

ANNE HATCHARD BREAKS STATS AND MEDAL VOTES RECORDS

Anne Hatchard had an incredible 2020 season personally for both the Adelaide Crows in the AFL and then for North Adelaide. Not only did she win the SANFLW Best and Fairest, she also won the Best Player in the Grand Final as well as being one of the 22 women in NAFC's first women's premiership. Unbelievably, and probably for the first time in history, in her five minor round matches she collected 3 votes (best on ground) in each game to give her 15 votes.

Anne Hatchard not only broke but smashed many SANFLW individual statistics records in her seven matches for North Adelaide this year. She finished with 243 disposals at an average of 34.71 per game. Her highest statistical match was Round 5 against Sturt, collecting 20 kicks and 22 handballs and totalling 42 possessions. To make this count even more amazing, they were collected in 68 minutes of game time (17 minute quarters). Using an average of 30 minute quarters in men's games, her stats would equate to a 74-possession match for a male in a SANFL/AFL game. Now that is taking your own ball to the game.

DAKOTA NIXON 2020 RESERVES MAGAREY MEDAL

Originally from Gepps Cross Football Club, the 22-year-old polled four first preferences in the eight matches in which he attracted votes from the field umpires.

The long-kicking left-footer was named in North's best players on seven occasions from his 13 Reserves appearances in 2020. Measuring in at 180cm and 76kg, Nixon is the Roosters' first Reserves Magarey Medallist since Luke Teasdale in 2014.

CHEERLEADERS

A pleasing aspect of 2020 amid the uncertainty and government restrictions was our senior squad of dancers, the 'Rockettes', being able to re-group and perform enthusiastically to our home & finals game day supporters. The team enjoyed the season and the opportunity to continue their involvement and support of our great Club. Sadly, despite beginning the year full of energy and high spirits, our junior squad the 'Roosters Dance Team' resolved to abandon the year, looking to return in 2021. I thank them for their acceptance of these unprecedented times.

2020 also marked a milestone year for our Rockette performer & choreographer Olivia Hatherly who has acquired 20 years of dancing in the red & white. We acknowledge this fantastic achievement and appreciate her commitment both as a dancer and later when she took on the added component of choreography.

4. PRESIDENTS REPORT

President Mr L. Virgin presented his report to the members.

2019 Report

The recent and ongoing suffering and devastation experienced across the country through bushfires and drought has certainly put many things into perspective as we began the challenges of 2020. In addition, the recent death at football training of Josh Henty-Smith shows how precious life really is.

Following some conversations we have had with the SANFL, they have now initiated a bushfire appeal weekend to run throughout the football communities in SA. This will likely be round 7 in May, where we will be able to donate to the emergency services efforts and all those who have been impacted.

The SANFL also got involved in the T20 cricket game featuring the Crows and Power players, which raised over \$1 million.

Following the extensive football review in 2017, one of the outstanding recommendations from the review was the initiation of an external Board review, to assess the skills required as Board members, our governance structure and what changes can be made to deliver a more efficient, cohesive Board for the members of NAFC.

A few important recommendations to come from this review was the introduction of portfolios for Board members such as Finance, Licenced Club, Marketing, Football and Youth Development, the separation of the role of League Director and President/Chairman, and the introduction of Board member terms of 3 x 3 year terms, and maximum of 4 terms at the discretion of the Board.

These recommendations are currently being discussed and considered by the Board.

We continue to be impacted by government legislation around gaming, an example being a councillor at the Port Adelaide Enfield Council's moving a motion to phase out all gaming machines from council owned buildings, including Grand North.

Fortunately, this decision was overturned following some great work behind the scenes from CEO Greg Edwards, but it demonstrated how critical it is to identify new revenue sources and reduce our exposure to these types of matters

Our Women's team have announced their new leadership group, with Leah Tynan as Captain, ably supported by Lauren Daniel, Kelly Barltrop, Ashleigh Woodland, Kristy Harvey and Amber Ward. We wish every success to Coach Krissie Steen and her team for the upcoming season opener against Glenelg on Saturday 15 February at 10.10am at Elizabeth Oval.

Neil Sanders has been very busy in 2019, getting to our country zone areas on 40 occasions, including several trips to Broken Hill which is technically no-one's zone in SA. He has been well supported by Wayne Jeffries on many occasions, and this effort has seen some great results with the high country zone content in our junior grades.

Craig Brooks, our Under 18's coach, has signalled 2020 will be a challenging year for his boys, but he often unearths some new talent as we have seen many times in the past. This season we'll see young guys like Jamison Murphy (who is also the captain of the State Cricket Team at under 16 level), and Tariq Newchurch, a highly talented indigenous lad from Port Augusta, come through to senior football at some stage.

Our first match for 2020 is Norwood at Norwood Oval on Friday 3 April, I can't wait for it to come along! We have our annual Golf Day at Tea Tree Gully Golf Course on Friday March 20, so get along to that, and our Gala Dinner is scheduled for Friday 17 July at Adelaide Oval which is very exciting.

We expect to be successful in 2020, I can feel a mood of excitement and anticipation around the Club as the season approaches.

5. SANFL REPORT

Our League Director Malcolm Ellis provided the members an update on SANFL matters:

M. Ellis welcomed all past and present players in the room.

It was a tough year for the SANFL with the lower attendances at the AFL matches at Adelaide Oval, including the lower returns from food and beverages

Audi Stadium returns were down, and they got hurt when the Metallica concert was cancelled. All these issues hurt all clubs, not just the SANFL.

On a positive note, the SANFL have continued to reduce their debt, and will be debt free in a year or so, and the ongoing growth of female football has been unbelievable. Now, 1 in 7 players are female, with female football participation up 24%.

The Adelaide Oval Hotel is well underway, a critical part of broadening the revenue streams and reducing exposure to the issues stated above.

The Checkside Tavern at West Lakes is being refurbished and will open again soon. This venue is on prime land opposite the shopping centre and will be an important revenue component of SANFL in the years ahead.

2020 AGM MEETING MINUTES CONTINUED...

- Thebarton Oval is now under lease to SANFL and will house the Talent Department as well as Umpires. The Adelaide Footy League will remain at the Oval and utilise the facilities with the SANFL needs.
- John Olsen has confirmed he will not be standing for re-election on the SA Football Commission which has thrown open the important role of Chairman of the Commission.
- John has done a great job managing the transition from Football Park to Adelaide Oval and navigating through the political environment surrounding football in SA.
- This will also enable certain governance changes to take place at SANFL, all of which is being worked through at present.

6.FINANCIAL REPORT

Finance Director Pat Hodby provided a presentation on the Clubs 2019 financial performance.

Key points were:

- Similar result to last year, resulting in a loss of \$97,992 (loss of \$80,754 last year).
 - The issue remains the performance of the Northern Tavern as compared to 3 or 4 years ago when the supermarket and bank was at the Centre, both great for creating foot traffic through the Tavern.
 - We are continuing the find ways to improve this result, along with the other two businesses (Grand North and NAFC).
 - Whilst we made a small loss, our cash profit continued to be quite strong at \$480,000 and we have paid a further \$123,000 off our core debt to the Council.
 - Team Maintenance (cost of football) has remained under control compared to previous years, and generally expenses have been held tight during these challenging times.
 - Our Consolidated Net Assets have come down from \$4,087,000 to \$3,758,000 due to 2 factors. One being the \$97,992 loss, the other being a write down of value against our gaming machines. Gaming machine market values are subject to trading rounds held by CBS, this year they are valued at \$11,000, down from \$17,000 2 years ago.
 - Grand North had a good 2019 year with gaming returns up, and whilst food was down, we saved on the expense of the Entertainment Book.
 - NAFC had a solid year, finishing on budget in most areas.
 - Our core debt went down from \$1.72 million to \$1.60 million.
- Pat offered a Q&A opportunity for members, however there no questions from the floor on the financial report.

10.SENIOR COACH PRESENTATION:

Jacob Surjan provided the members an update of the pre-season program, recruiting and general football information.

Key points made by Jacob were:

•Pre-season Training:

o Has been excellent so far under new Fitness Coach Jay Collison. all players have bought into the program and there have been may personal bests throughout

o Have many new players on the track this year which is great, and we're seeing the young guys emerge from last year also.

Recruiting:

o We have recruited heavily this summer, and we've been lucky to get back some former Roosters from the AFL like Harrison Wigg, Kym LeBois and Cam Hewett. In addition, we also got Robbie Young back which was a bonus.

o All new recruits have been very good on the track, all fit and ready to go and have come with great attitude. Andrew Moore, who has been a premierships captain at Box Hill, has demonstrated his professionalism in preparation and training standards which has been great.

List Management:

o Darryl Wintle has done a great in putting together a solid, talented list for 2020. He has worked hard to ensure we are getting good people, not just good players. Well done to Darryl for all the great work.

oOur list has good speed and size and will suit our quick ball movement game style and defensive play.

Game Style:

o We want to be a quick side who defends well. Modern football has quick players to get out of trouble and carry the ball, but it also has some old traditional components too, like defensive positioning and tackling pressure.

o As I said, I think we have a list capable of playing a highly skilled, fast paced game, as well as defend the dangerous space behind the ball.

Fitness and Conditioning:

o We have added Jay Collison as our Fitness and Conditioning Coach, who is a thorough professional.

o Jay comes from a soccer background in England and worked for a Div 2 team in the EPL. He is very talented, and the players have responded well to his program over the summer, which has been very hard.

Jacob threw it open to the floor for any questions:

Q: Why didn't we recruit a ruckman?

A: We have very capable ruckmen at the club already, we have a fit James Craig back on the track after injuries over the past 2 years, and we also have Alex Barns and Mitch Harvey who have shown they are capable in the ruck.

Q: How are the returning AFL players going?

A: They are all going well. Wigg is ready to join the main group after knee rehabilitation and is looking really good. Cam Hewett is a big bodied mid who you will all love. At 6'2", he will be important as an inside mid with Tom Schwarz and Andrew Moore. Kym LeBois has had hamstring history at Carlton, but he is managing that well to now and getting better and better. He is a smooth moving forward with a great kick. Andrew Moore will be a great support to Alex Spina and the leadership of the group.

Q: Any injury concerns?

A: Andrew Moore has had shoulder surgery but will be available round 1, and Lewis Hender has been battling groin soreness over the summer but we hopeful he will ready to go. Sam McInerney is our only big concern as he is battling a slipped disc in his back. Our focus with him is just to get his back right for himself and his life, any footy talk can come later.

Q: Lachlan Borg – how is he going?

A: He's coming back from injury as you know, but he's working hard in rehab and making progress which is great.

Q: What about Jack Blair?

A: Jack has been training with Werribee in the VFL after having a discussion with Mark Williams. He was looking to return to us if it didn't work out, but it appears he will stay in Melbourne, where he is from.

Q: How is Keenan Ramsey going?

A: Having a great summer's training, Keenan is fit and ready to go

Q: How do you keep the motivation of the boys up between now and the first game?

A: We mix it up a fair bit, we cycle our training loads, so the boys get plenty work and plenty of rest to keep fresh.

Q: How is Ben Jarman going?

A: He is flying at present, has been excellent since Christmas now the balls and the games are out! He has been very impressive across half back in our short games which is great.

Q: How is Lee Minervini going?

A: Lee is going well also, he is great trainer and his pre-season has been excellent. He'll get his opportunities in 2020.

Q: What about Billy Hartung?

A: We worked hard to get Billy across during last year, and he finally committed before Christmas and has since moved over. Billy is very fit, probably our fittest player and he will be playing wing and inside mid. He is a natural run and carry player but also is tough inside, so we'll be utilising all his skills.
